



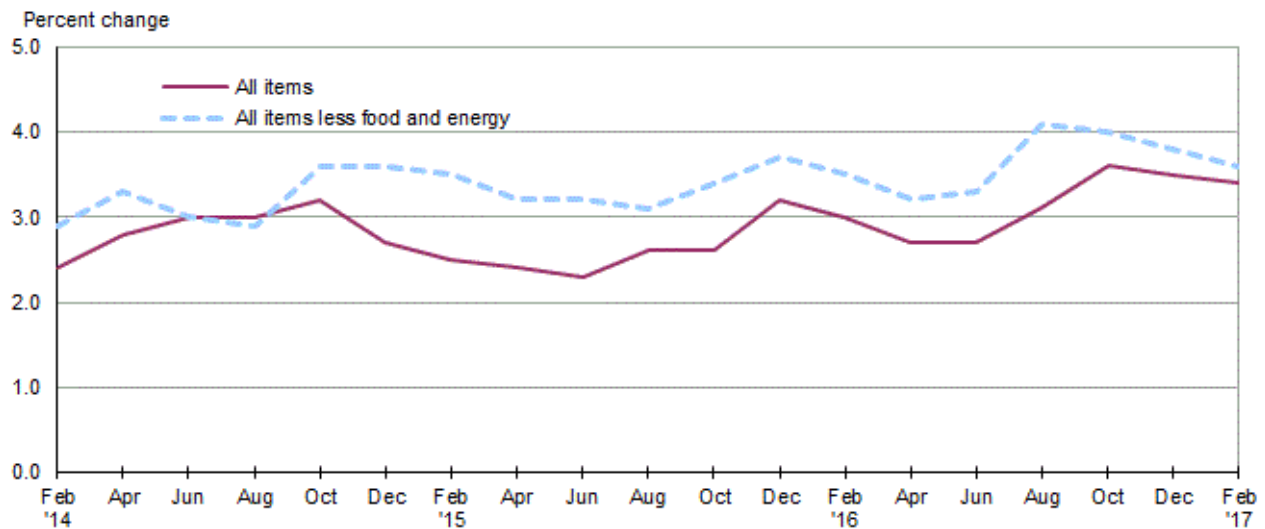
Consumer Price Index, San Francisco Area

- In February 2017, the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers (CPI-U) increased by 0.8 percent for the past two months ending in February. The rise in prices is due to higher prices for shelter, apparel, and gasoline.
- CPI-U rose 3.4 percent in the last 12 months as seen in the table and Chart 1. Energy prices increased by 11.0 percent due to higher gasoline prices. The index for all items less food and energy increased by 3.6 percent during the year.
