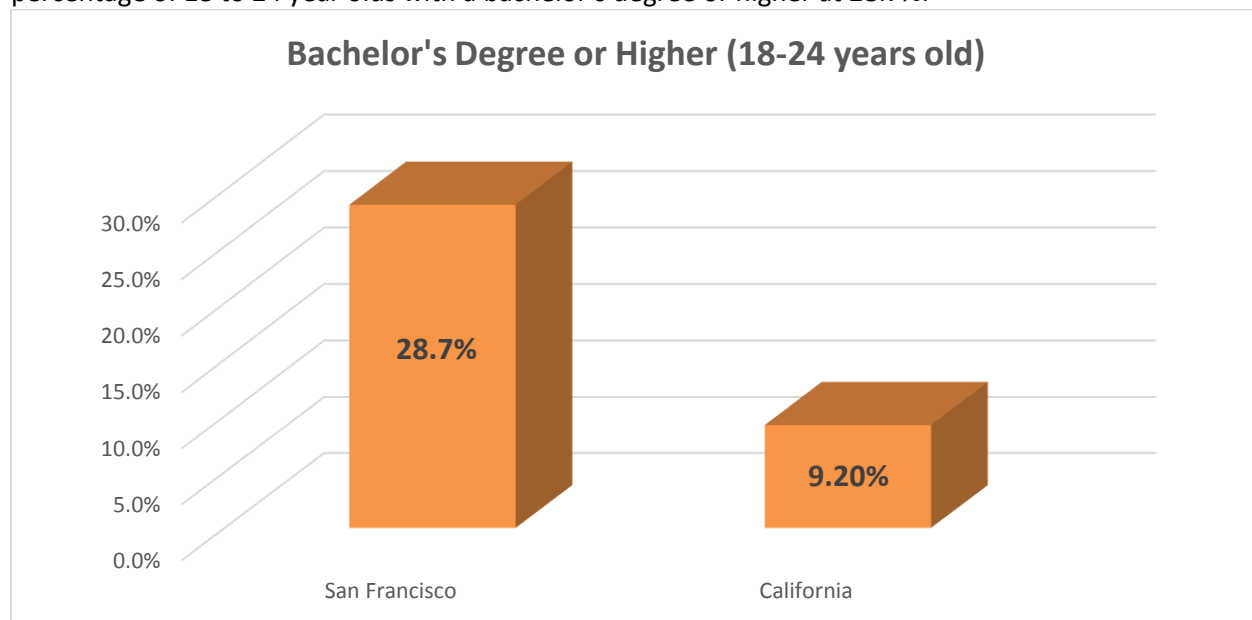

Figure 1: Educational attainment level among 18 to 24 years and 25 years and over in San Francisco, 2015

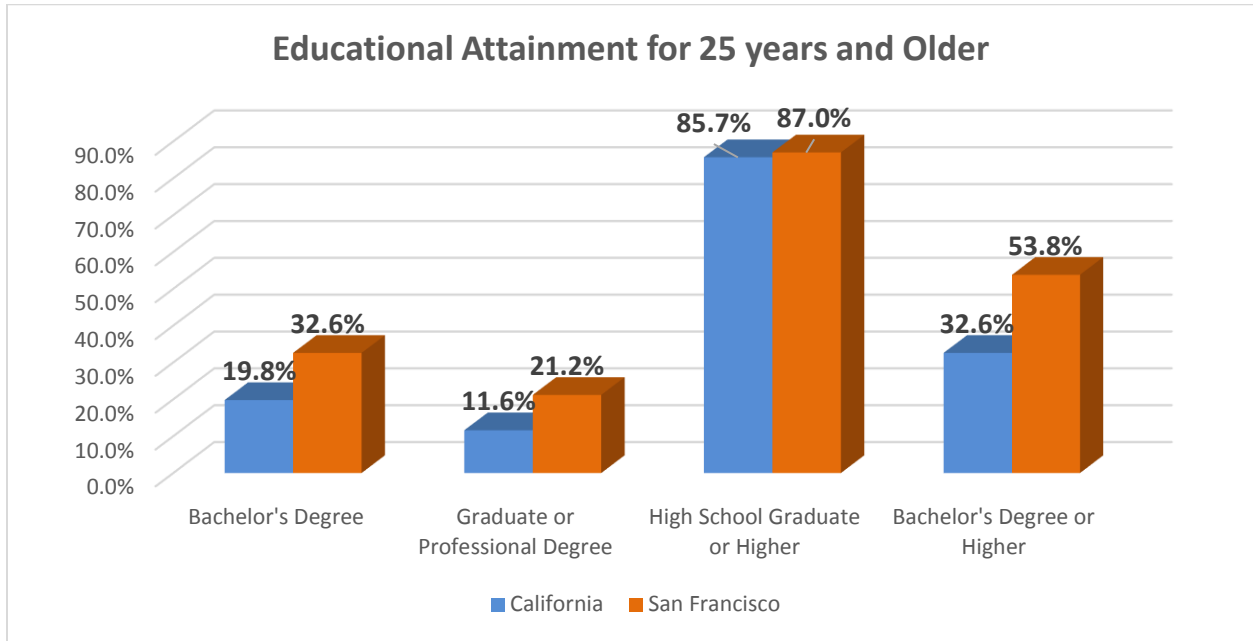
When these San Francisco Educational statistics are compared to the educational attainment in California, the vast difference in the level of educated people in the San Francisco area is obvious. In California, 9.2% of 18 to 24 years have attained a bachelor's degree or higher. However, in San Francisco, there is a higher percentage of 18 to 24 year olds with a bachelor's degree or higher at 28.7%.



Similarly, when comparing the educational attainment level between California and San Francisco in the 25 years and above age group, San Francisco's had higher percentages than California in four categories.

These four categories are:

- 1) Bachelor's Degree
- 2) Graduate or Professional Degree
- 3) High school graduate or higher
- 4) Bachelor's degree or higher
